

GRANDMASTER'S SAY

hen we first held our Committee Meeting in March on the much awaited 888th Run, the first question that came to mind was, "How to attract Malaysian Hashers to a Singapore Run." Our girls are not prettier than theirs and not as sexy as "Mor Lea Foo" (touch your trouser) and

our guys cannot shout CCB as loud as Seng Bok nor as good looking as KORKY or as butter-smooth as Walter. Our Ah Kwas (transvestites) cannot excite the daylight out of the CAMEL or the BEAR. Our strong S\$ and our exorbitant hotel rates don't help either. The only reason the Malaysian hashers can be attracted here is because Singapore has the Seletar Guzzlers - one of the friendliest, craziest, ice-cold-bum loving, icewater-splashing bunch of wankers in this region. Anyway, invitations went out and here you are. Seletar had always taken pride in organising our celebration run. We hope you will enjoy this run as much as the previous ones. Singapore hashers have always given us great support too. A big THANKS to them.





Since the early 1980s, costs for running in an outstation hash in Malaysta/Singapore have increased - along with inflation. Used to be S\$10 and now about S\$20-\$30, still affordable to most. The major interhashes (e.g. Interhash, Nash Hash, and Pan Asia,), on the other hand are a different story. What used to be about US\$40 for a three day event way back in 1982 can now set you back by as much as US\$200. I guess inflation, increased sophistication in the presentation, expensive stage props,

professional shows and peripherals take up the chunk of the cost. However, one wonders if grand hotel receptions, watching professional stage decor and shows, eating out of silver cutlery are some of the things that hashers go for in an interhash meet. For most, attending interhash meets provides a good opportunity to be a part of the magical moment ("I was there!"), to absorb the warm ambience of a giant gathering of people, strike up new friendships and renew old ones. If time permits, some tours and sight-seeing. For survival, a "decent" meal of carbo, vegetables and meat will suffice and of course a couple of beers to wash the food down - simple needs. By trimming off the non-essentials, an interhash event can

be organised for much less than what is being charged nowadays. Seems like each interhash event costs more than the former one. A fee of US\$80 for a 3 day event should be reasonable and affordable, which in turn encourages greater participation.



Bring back the basics to hashing - open field, good food, hash shows, lots of booze and great company. Most hashers can do without the frills at a lower cost. Rumour has it that Singapore is trying to put



together a Nash Hash Meet in Singapore in 1997. We hope to have your support if it becomes a reality. Thank you for being a part of our 888th. Do take advantage of our hospitality and enjoy the two days event in Singapore to its fullest. For the Malaysians, do try to stay for the Sunday do (same runsite). We will clear the Causeway for your speedy return on Sunday afternoon.





I also mentioned in that forward that Seletar and The Singapore Hash should have a joint run. We nearly did twice, but owing to reasons difficult to explain we did not.


As this is a good opportunity, may I suggest that why not all the 4 Hashes in Singapore get together and have a good bang.



THE GENEALOGY OF THE HASH HOUSE HARRIERS

The current state of development of the Family Tree of the Hash House Harriers is shown on the following pages, and covers some 200 Hash Clubs, worldwide, out of around 1250 or so active known clubs, and many more extinct or dormant. We are endeavouring to have the Family Tree virtually complete for Interhash '98 in Kuala Lumpur, showing the whole Hash movement's links back to the Mother Hash, and there is still a long way to go. The Singapore hashes are all derived from Singapore H³, which was the first legitimate daughter of the Mother Hash, founded by Ian Cumming of KLH³ in 1962. However, Singapore H³ was not the 'first born' as, unbeknownst to anyone else, an 'illegitimate' predecessor, the Royal Bordighera H³, had been started on the Italian Riviera in 1947, by Gus McKay who had run as a guest with KLH³ before the war, but the club did not survive.

But what a virile parent Singapore H³ has turned out to be, with almost half the Hash clubs on the known family tree descended from it, and probably many more to come. In 1966, when Mother Hash had her 1000th Run, there were only ten known clubs in existence, gathered in K. L. from Singapore, Kuching, Jesselton, Brunei, Miri, Sibu, Sandakan, Ipoh and Penang, all from Malaysia, Singapore and Brunei. Now, Singapore H³'s 'children' run all over Malaysia and Brunei, and in Cyprus, New Zealand, U. K., U. S. A., Tanzania, Nigeria, Indonesia, Norway, India and who knows how many other places besides!

Even in 1973, for the 1500th Run of Mother Hash, the worldwide list had only grown to 36 clubs in 12 countries, with the addition of Seremban, Johore Bahru, Kluang, Muar, Batu Gajah and Tawau in Malaysia; Sydney, Perth, Melbourne, Canberra, Brisbane, Hoabrt and Wollomooloo in Australia; Panguna and Port Moresby in P. N. G.; Plymouth and Liss in U. K.; Episkopi and Dhekelia in Cyprus; plus Jakarta, Bahrein, Washington DC, Hong Kong, Taipei, Seoul and Durban. Some 300 runners assembled in K. L. for what was, in effect, the second unofficial Interhash. They had a marvelous run in the hills behind the Zoo and, by the sound of it, a fantastic party afterwards.

But the 'explosion' of hashing had started, and by the 21 June 1980, only seven years later, when Seletar Hash House Harriers was founded (by James Sandosham and 17 'others'), there were about 200 Hash clubs worldwide in 33 countries. The range now included the Solomons, Fiji, New Zealand, the Philippines, Croatia, Vanuatu, Oman, Japan, Pakistan, Finland, Thailand, Bangladesh, Costa Rica, the Cayman Islands, Denmark, Gambia, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Jordan, Kenya, Nepal, Saudi Arabia, Sierra Leone, Sri Lanka, Tunisia and the U. A. E.! The deadly virus of Hashing had spread worldwide and was continuing to expand.

Today we have about 1700 Hash clubs (including the dormant ones, the bike hashes, the junior 'horrors', the 'muff divers' etc. etc.), in some 160 countries worldwide. The concept of a little healthy exercise, followed by a few drinks, a meal and a few irreverant songs, seems to meet a lot of people's needs for relaxation. So, if you have vital information on your Hash club, which is not on the family tree and is thus currently 'illegitimate', please jot down the founder's name, the date of the first run and the hash club from which the founder came on a piece of paper and fax it to Bill Panton in K. L. (on 253.7992) or Mike Lyons (on 255.8988).

HASHCLUSIVE: INTERHASH '98

An Interview with Alex BEAR Thomas Deputy Chairman, Interhash '98 Organising Committee Chairman, Malaysian Hash Council

Seletar's CNN brings you this hashclusive interview with the BEAR. Hear now the latest word on Interhash '98.

Q: We are delighted that the hashing world has chosen Malaysia, and Kuala Lumpur in particular, for its next international jamboree. A great deal of planning and work must have been put in by your organising committee to secure this bid. Tell us how you managed to gain the support of the world for this gargantuan event.

BEAR: First of all we must remember that 1998 is the 60th year of the founding of Hash and a lot of sentiments must have come into play. Upon realising that, the committee had aptly dubbed the event "The Homecoming Diamond Celebration".



The Interhash Committee was formed over two years ago at a Grand Masters' meeting of Malaysian Hash Chapters and as finance was a key factor to garner support worldwide, 100 bonds at RM500 was offered to hashers on the proviso that the bonds were not redeemable if our bid at Cyprus was not successful. The response was overwhelming. All bonds were sold. Fliers were sent at regular intervals with Tourist Development Board brochures on Malaysia as inserts. With support from our national carrier MAS. Hash emissaries were sent to major Hash events around the world, eg. Aussie Nash Hash, Pan Asia 95, Euro Hash, UK Nash Hash, All America Hash. Presentations and lobbying at these events definitely created an impact and made known our serious intentions to host Interhash '98.

At Cyprus the presentation was a combined effort of the Committee and the presence of representatives of our sponsors. MAS, Guiness Anchor Berhad, S. A. Tours, at hand to answer queries, definitely gave us an edge.

Commitment, hard work, and the knowledge that major sponsors were backing us must have resulted in the landslide in votes favouring Malaysia as the venue for Interhash '98.

Q: If memory serves me right, Interhash '80 was held in Kuala Lumpur, hosted by the Mother Hash (KLH3). With Interhash '98 coming back to Malaysia, we have come a full swing to the land where hashing had its birth. I gather the Mother Hash will also be celebrating 60 years of hashing?

BEAR: Yes, you are right, Interhash 1980 was hosted by Kuala Lumpur H3. It was a tame affair with about 1000 participants, in contrast to between 6000 to 8000 participants we expect in '98. Whilst Mother Hash would be celebrating its 60 years of hashing, I believe that this Diamond Jubilee of Hash is a legacy to all hashers around the world. It would be most fitting to celebrate this event at the Interhash in Kuala Lumpur.

HASHCLUSIVE: INTERHASH '98

Q: How did Interhash, as a world gathering of the finest of hash culture, first come about? When did it start, and which countries have hosted this biennial event?

BEAR: CHEE-BY is the best person to comment on this. I'll pass over to him.

Q: Have you been to all the Interhashes? Which were exceptional?

BEAR: I have not been to all the Interhashes. Of the 10 Interhashes held, I have been to six, hence I am really not able to say which were exceptional. However, I have fond memories of Sydney Interhash, where the organisation was superb. Pattaya was not too bad. There are only 5 hashers in the world who have attended all the Interhashes, and one of them would be a better person to answer this.

Q: What programmes have you lined up for Interhash '98?

BEAR: The Interhash is still two years away, and all that we have is a tentative programme. As in all previous Interhashes, it will be a three day event. The first day will be a meet and greet party night, and hash runs and shows on the second and third nights.

Pre-rambles, post-rambles and a hash cruise are all on the cards. So, for that period, there will be plenty in store for visiting hashmen.

Special air fares are being structured by MAS and S. A. Tours will be organising tours to Malaysian and South East Asian destinations.

Q: How many participants do you expect? How can we register at this stage?

BEAR: We are expecting about 6,000 to 8,000 participants. About 1,700 participants have registered in Cyprus and 100 free registrations have been given to bond holders.

Registration forms have been sent to over 1,200 Hash Chapters worldwide and registration must be on the forms provided and accompanied with the registration fee. The cut off date for US\$100 registration fee is 31st December 1996. So please send in your registrations early.

Q: Interhash 98 will probably coincide (within a week we guess) with Seletar's 1000th celebration. Shall we throw in Seletar as a bonus?

BEAR: Interhash '98 will be held from the 2nd to 4th of October 1998 and if this is within a week of Seletar's 1000th run, what an opportune time it will be to celebrate this event as a pre- or post-ramble to Interhash '98. With MAS giving free of charge flights from Kuala Lumpur to Singapore to participants on long hauls, I think you will have a lot of support from overseas hashes.

ANNUAL HASH AWARDS 1995

A good Tuesday hash evening is made up of several parts: a good run, a good circle, good makan (on-site or eatout), and of course plenty of beer. The hares spend a lot of time, money, and effort to make sure that everything is perfect. Since a hashman typically hares only one run per year, he will try his best to plan the best hash evening possible.

The annual hash awards at the annual D&D in December 1995 recognized the efforts of the hares during the twelve months since the last D&D in December 1994. Awards were presented for the Best Scribe Report, Best On-Site Makan, Best Eatout, Best T-Shirt, Best Run, and Worst Run (also known as Hash Shit Of The Year). The Committee voted to select the award winners. In most of the categories, it was very difficult to pick one winner, because there were so many good hashes in 1995. Many of the award nominees are mentioned below, but in the end the Committee had to pick just one winner for each award.

The scribe report is something that many hashmen take for granted. A lot of the assigned scribes never turn in their reports, and many of the scribes who do write a report spend just a few minutes to scribble some rubbish on a piece of paper just to satisfy their duty. However, this isn't fair to the hares, who have spent a lot of time and effort preparing the run. The hares deserve to see a good writeup of their efforts appear in the newsletter. A hashman is typically assigned scribe duty less than once a year, so it shouldn't be much work to spend some time writing one good report. There were only a few good reports in 1995 where the scribes actually put some time and thought into their work. The Seletar Hash Literary Appreciation Society felt that four of these scribe reports deserved recognition. COCKSUCKER's scribe report for Run 788 was a literary fantasy that could only have been written under the influence of mind-altering chemicals. BARBIE DOLL's poetic ode to Run 792 also displayed a unique approach which stands out from the normal narratives. KICHIBHAI's scribe report for Run 822 was creative and well-written as usual; in fact, KICHIBHAI's scribe report for Run 764 was the winner in last year's voting, but he was deprived of the award by kelong. However, the winner of the 1995 award for the best scribe report won the Committee's vote by a clear majority, and it is especially good to see such a fine effort by a new boot: MOTHER-IN-LAW for Run 819.

Makan is an important part of every event in Singapore, and most Tuesdays the makan is eaten on-site. Some hares provide cheap \$2 packets of nasi lemak, and some hares spend a lot of money on fancy dinners, but the award for Best On-Site Makan is not given just for the most money spent. The Committee was looking for makan that was unique or special in some way, not just the same old shit. The makan should be tasty and plentiful. There were many candidates, and it was very difficult to pick a winner, but award was given for on-site makan that was definitely unusual, nicely presented, and part of an overall run theme: the Oktoberfest Run (Run 824) by MUFFDIVER, ARMLESS, and BANANA MAN.

There was a lot of discussion about which runs qualified for the Best Eatout award. The annual "special runs" (Chinamen, Kwailoh, and Deepavali) are not considered, because the cost of these events is much higher than a normal eatout. Normal eatouts are scheduled for every fourth run. However, there were a couple of cases this year where makan was provided at a location away from the run site, even though the runs were not scheduled eatouts. The Committee decided that any makan which was not eaten on-site should fall into the eatout category. The two top contenders for the Best Eatout were both unscheduled eatouts. The World War II Run 830 by SUMA TALAY, HASH FLASHER, and S. M. Chua was a close runner-up, but the Committee decided to award the Best Eatout to POPEYE and KANSALAH for Run 818 at Jalan Sendudok.

ANNUAL HASH AWARDS 1995 (continued)

The Best T-Shirt award was very difficult to decide because we had so many good T-Shirts in 1995. The 1995 T-shirts were modeled at the D&D by some of the lovely hash wives. The hat and towel from the World War II run were possibly the most unique giveaways in 1995, but the Committee decided to keep this award for T-shirts exclusively (despite SUMA TALAY's attempts to bribe the Committee). Based on a survey of the T-shirts which are worn most often on Tuesday nights, the Austrian Run T-shirt (from LOUDER and SPERMINATOR) and the Oktoberfest T-shirt (from MUFFDIVER, ARMLESS, and BANANA MAN) were two of the most popular designs this year. However, the Committee didn't want to give any more awards to the Huns, so (by a narrow margin) the award for Best T-Shirt went to PETER SELLERS and Dick THE PRICK's pricks (Run 825).

The Best Run category is always difficult to decide, because everyone has their own idea of what a good run should be. BARBIE DOLL likes a two hour marathon through streams and mud, while BUDGIE prefers a short stroll down to the nearest kopi tiam. The Committee was looking for a run that was long enough to be good exercise, but not so long that hashmen were still crawling in from the dark after two hours. Runs where FATIMAH consulted were automatically disqualified. The best runs kept the pack together with checks and false trails, and made good use of a variety of terrain (while keeping everyone guessing as to the route). Future hares should note that almost all of the nominees which were considered for the Best Run award in 1995 were laid in the Mandai area. Honorable mentions go to PETER SELLERS and Dick THE PRICK for Run 825 at Mandai Track 16, and to the three Huns for the Oktoberfest Run at Jalan Ulu Sembawang. However, by a very close vote, the award for the Best Run Of The Year went to NAVIGATOR, VIRGINIA SLIM, and ANAL for the American Independence Day '95 Run.

The award for Worst Run Of The Year (sometimes called Hash Shit Of The Year) is normally awarded automatically to CINDERELLA and ATOMIC ROD. However, these two have finally gotten the message, and they did not set a run together in 1995. The choice was still quite easy. It took precisely 5.8 seconds for the Committee to vote unanimously to award the Hash Shit Of The Year to the run which took three hours to lay by motorbike. No hashman completed the entire run, and this had nothing to do with the fact that it was pouring down rain all night. The only reason that the hares were not murdered instantly on-site was the good ring-burner curry that they provided. But even good makan cannot rescue a true hash shit run. How many of you hashmen remember Run 814 at Kent Ridge by orangutan-lookalike AH MENG and that c**t PAPA SMURF?

In addition to the normal awards for 1995, there was one very special award presented. There was one hash in 1995 that could have been considered in several different categories: Best Run, Best T-Shirt, and Best On-Site Makan (or perhaps Best Eatout). Perhaps the run itself wasn't the best run of the year, and perhaps there were other T-shirts that were just as colorful, but overall the whole evening (including the runsite, the makan, and the on-on-on) was definitely a once-in-a-lifetime event. Therefore, an award was presented for the Best Hash of the year to STRAIGHT SPOUT and PERFECT for the perfect Run 817 on Pulau Tekong.

Many of the Seletar hashmen set great runs last year with good makan and wild On-On-Ons. Those who did not receive an award should not feel cheated. There was a lot of good competition for the awards in 1995, and we expect to see even better competition in 1996 as this year's hares do their best to organize hash events which their fellow hashmen will consider for the 1996 Annual Seletar Hash Awards.

Report of the 370km Road-Relay Run from Singapore to Petaling Jaya 9-10 May 1996

When Malaysia's PM Dr. Mahathir urged his youth to be adventurous and go for the South Pole or the top of Mt. Everest, Seletar's GM SAYETING at once started a relay from Singapore to Petaling Jaya, so that when the flag is planted, Seletar's logo will be pinned to it.

"Journey of a thousand miles begins with one step". Nobody knows if the Sage took that step. But we did, at 4.45am at the Woodlands McDonald's car park when the GM flagged us off.

I carried the baton as I was the first runner (accompanied by daughter, Ruby, who had collected a sizable donation from Wednesday Hash). Crossed Causeway, cleared Immigration and along the coastal Jalan Skudai, taking it easy on a bright dry morning. Then, even before we could welcome the dawn, we had



finished our stretch, when I handed the baton over to Roger RABBIT. The car escorts with a wheelchair rider from the Singapore Sports Council for the Disabled (whose charity this relay was in aid of), followed the lone runner, when he handed over to KY JELLY, further up the old trunk road. Team Leader SUKU, true to his name and driving the next runner, missed the turning to Pontian. When SUKU realised his mistake and retrieved the route, KY had already done 2 stretches (and refused help from OPERA), and had completed their sector of the run. SMALL SIZE spent \$26 on taxi fare to bring him to the run, only to be shocked when told that he did not need to run anymore. Seeing SMALL SIZE almost in tears with disappointment, **KICHIBHAI** offered his 2km for him to complete.

"14 runners to cover 52 km?" said the leader KICHIBHAI, "I don't know if my boys can do it, see, we are not serious runners, most of us are short cutters on normal run, I will have to work on these guys

to get them going." Anyway, KICHI got his boys going alright, in flying colours to be exact..By doing short stretches of 0.5km to 2km, even GENERAL looked like a runner. The team was able to run at speeds of between 11-14 km/hour, and covering their sectors 45 minutes ahead of schedule. After the run, the team in their beer laden a/c bus headed straight to a Toddy joint, seafood and massage etc etc. After the day of fun, they returned to Singapore, giving Petaling Jaya a pass. Team 5 which originally consisted of 4, finally on the day of the run was down to one, the leader, when the rest pulled out due to work commitments etc. With SNAKE HIP recruited by the GM at the last minute. KICHIBHAI's team finished in grand style at the Benut Police Station. We had to call off our planned lunch because KICHIBHAI was running too fast and was 45 minutes ahead of schedule. "What the heck, only 22km to cover, we'll finish it quickly and then have lunch", said TWO STROKE (2S). The run started at 12.30pm by 2S doing the first leg, who intended to do about 30 minutes before passing over the baton to the SH. 20 minutes later TS's tonque was

dragging on the road. As we proceeded, the scorching sun was killing. However with the help of SIBOK, SHORTIE ROO and FLUTER (who happened to drop in at this crucial time), and changing their tactic from long, half hour stretches, to short, 10 minute stretches, Sector 5 was completed about 30 minutes ahead of time. While the runners took a break at the roadside drink stall and waited for LOST AND FOUND, we saw him zooming pass in his Saab, missing the Escort car, Team car and about 10 guys by the side of the road - this guy must be blind. Luckily we were able to contact him by phone and he made a U-turn back to our rendezvous point.

L&F who undertook to complete Sector 6 alone, was ready in a minute, "22km? No problem lah. I just did the Marathon last month", off he went on a fast pace. Half hour into his run, he was signalling the Escort car for water. Another 15 minutes and more water, we could see that the sun had taken a heavy toll on him. "Gee! the temperature is killing me," said L&F. Anyway, SNAKE

HIP and TWO STROKE were at hand to help out. After a 15 minute break and a good helping of 100 Plus, L&F was on his way again. He did a total of at least 18 km and 7 hills over some very scenic spots before Melaka, however in the condition he was in, he probably won't be able to enjoy it. "Phew! Another hill, f**k the GM for setting me up". After completing his sector of the run, a quick change of clothing and he was off on his way back to Singapore. That's the Seletar spirit, my good guy.

Sector 7 was covered by a Yankee, a SIBOK, a Kangaroo and 2 very hungry Chinamen who had not had lunch. As reported by SHORTIE ROO, me and my \$1200/week rented Corolla (!) picked up FLUTER at lunch time and together with my other half (need you mention who?), had a

nice drive along the coastal road and arrived before the changeover point way ahead of time (1½ hours early). Had a little snacks and drinks with the GM and the SSC for the Disabled guys and runners. It was a very hot afternoon and I had to run bare-body. Together with SIBOK and FLUTER, we helped out in sector 5 and 6 and continued to run on our sector doing 3 km stretch at a time. At this point the disabled joined in the run. Passed through little township with many starry eyes and clapping of hands along the way. Took a couple of shots with my camera along the way and later at the hotel in Melaka realised that there was no film in the bloody camera inside! Anyway, finished our sector and off to Melaka to party on. P/s had a few beers along the relay run. VIRGINIA SLIME and TIGHT ARSE were called to rescue our Marshal's "Pizza Racer



Steamer" which ran out in full steam at the NS HWY. We took over the baton just before 8.00pm which was 20km North of BP and managed to catch up with time. As ATOMIC ROD had not turned up for the first stretch of the run (f**king pearl diver cannot keep a straight time), TIGHT ARSE took over and was really enjoying the run and the motivation from the 2 police escort cars. He did 8.5km before handing over to VIRGINIA SLIME who immediately promised to complete the rest

of the 21 km if ATOMIC ROD did not turn up. Finally, to the disappointment of VIRGINIA SLIME and the relief of the leader, ATOMIC ROD arrived in his "matchbox" car. After completed 10 klicks, ATOMIC ROD kept shouting "its hurting, its hurting", in great pain. But after a few hundred meters, we arrived in Muar. The curious people along the streets applauded with encouragement. ATOMIC ROD was really in high spirit. So high that he had forgotten about the pain and he just kept on going until he completed sector 9 in 2 hours and 40 minutes.

Although their run starts at 2253 hours, KERETAPI and his team consisting of MOHD ALI, SMALL THING, and Lawrence Tham met at Woodland McDonald's at 6.00 pm.and proceeded to JB



for an intended dinner. On the way we received an SOS phone call from TOUCH-ME-NOT and SKIDMARKS requesting us to pick them up because of the breakdown of their vehicle. We picked



them up at the highway and headed straight for Muar for the much awaited dinner. While the team was enjoying the chicken rice and noodle at a hawker stall, KERETAPI was treated to a hair raising experience of slalom riding in the evening Muar traffic on a motor bike, in his mission to buy ice for his team. Phew! This is just as bad as Bangkok. We were somewhat lost in our route to the changeover until one Kwailoh put us to shame by leading us to our destination. As we were changing into our running gear, we could see the police lead car with the Flasher in the horizon. "Wah! 23 minutes ahead of schedule." SMALL THING, our elite runner, took off like an arrow in the wind. This guy is so carried away by the fun of being escorted by the police

vehicle that he kept on going, "two more km, lah". The police almost led us to the opposite direction if not for our familiarity of the area due to the extra "rounding around" when we were lost. Anyway, we guided the police across the bridge and headed straight to Melaka, on target. Because of the enlarged team (6 runners), we did fun run by doing short stretch. Even the not-quite-float-like-a-butterfly MOHD ALI, was so enthusiastic that he forgot about his Computer (which was recently upgraded and not properly run in) and put in a fair share of running for his team. "Wise man say the strength of your CPU depend on how much work and exercise you put in" Keep it going, ALI. The team who finished in high spirit after a last minute rescue by SMALL THING who covered the last 6 km by himself, headed for Melaka for another fun marathon session of alcohol abuse, sleeping only at 5.00am in the morning. Our sincere heartfelt thanks to Lawrence Tham and SMALL THING for their sacrifice. They returned to Singapore in the wee hours of the morning after the run.

With some earlier mishaps with the borrowed Hyundai, the team comprising of VIRGINIA SLIME and STRAIGHT SPOUT arrived at 8km out of BP in a Mitsubishi to take over from SAYETING as Marshals of the graveyard shift. OPD and SGT. BILKO was to drive up from Singapore to reenforced this team later. As we took to to the road one by one in the approaching darkness of dusk, an air of excitement prevailed. Villagers were greeting with smiles and cheers. Later SGT. BILKO took to the road and he went as though the PONTIANAK was behind him. One of SAF secret fighting machines, he covered 13.5km at about 13km/hr. Phew! what a run, we had to stop him from running, otherwise there won't be anything for others to run. While Marshal STRAIGHT SPOUT was keeping his eyes on the runners, VIRGINIA SLIME was constantly trying his best with SS's wife at the back seat. "Now, I was really in trouble, don't know whether to keep my eye on VS or on the runner." SS confessed later. There was an overly enthusiastic display of egoism when VS snatched the baton from OPD in a desperate attempt to outdo the good Sergeant, who probably put VS in the backseat with his powerful run earlier. Eventually, OPD was assigned his share of the run. He completed the last 5km in 54 minutes. "How to run so slow", came the reply. Anyway he did, 5 steps forward and 4 step backwards, the team arrived at the changeover point. The team agreed it was one hell-of-a eventful road relay, enjoyed by all, including Mrs. Truly.

FIRST BLOOD's team performances can best can be described in two simple words, *FOOD* and *LUXURY*. They met in FB's *luxury* house, drove up to Melaka in a *luxury* car, had a *luxurious* dinner at the seafront stall, slept in style in a *luxurious* suite, took over the run at changeover point right in front of their hotel, finished the run and had more *food*. Unfortunately, as should be expected, the GM and his team of merry men, about 20 of them, came to the room after completing their sectors of the run. Plenty of drinks, the famous Kajang satay and welcoming hands of PJ and Kajang Hashers. Whereby marked the ending of a historical run - the longest road relay run (370 kms) ever done by Seletar. It will be quite some time before someone comes along to organise a run of this distance.

SELETAR HHH INAUGURAL GOLF '96 3 July 1996 at Raffles Country Club

The idea of a golf tournament for hashers was mooted during the Charity Relay Run to Petaling Jaya, KL in May. A few diehard golfers ("Tomato" Gan, "Pweee" Chan, "Kreta Api" Willie, "Popeye" Rajoo, "Two Strokes" James, to name a few), had lugged their golf bags, run and golfed all the way from the Causeway to PJ. The prizes were very attractive, with a full set of golf clubs for the overall champion and crystal trophies for all the champions. The Crystal Challenge Trophy and Division Champion crystal trophies were donated by the past and present Seletar GMs. Sadly, no one had an ace for the blue Rover 216 CPE. For the 2/3 participants without the prizes, the lucky draw prizes were even more attractive - \$1000 dollars worth of Karaoke and liquor at My Wife's Place, XO brandy, super Stereo set, drivers and many others. "Two Days", who also played his virgin 18-hole game, walked away with the \$300 graphite driver for the lucky draw. The Inaugural Event was a great success. "HASHING IN THE EARLY DAYS" Leon NUTS Lui

When I was young and in my prime, I used to do it all the time. Now I'm old and my hair is grey, I can only do it once a day. Even then, it takes me all night to do what I used to do all night.

After twenty-nine years of on and off hashing, I must admit that I am not the hashman that I used to be. When I started hashing in Sandakan back in 1967, I was not old enough to drive! So, I did not have to worry about driving home after the on-on-on. In those days, I do not suppose hashmen had to worry about being caught driving with too much alcohol in their blood. We only had to worry about running off the road because the drain jumped out in front of us, or running into a tree which also jumped in front of us. Luckily, roads were not as crowded then. We were also lucky as the cars those days could not travel very much faster than 30 mph.

Back then, the attendance was very low. Maybe twenty odd each week. The Grand Master happened to work for the Anchor Beer distributor, so the hares just had to pick up the few crates of beer, chill them, serve them, pay for whatever was consumed and then return the rest which will probably be sold to unsuspecting outlets. The runs can be short and all of them were live hare runs. I remembered the run where we were missing a runner. When we sent out the search party, we found him perched on a tree, settled in for the night. Wild panthers and bears were not uncommon in the area we run in. Ice was not easy to come by, so we did not have the circle and we did not have to sit on ice. No food was served, so we terrorise a restaurant after the run and usually drink them dry. Wine, dine and song went hand in hand even then, so we did drank, ate and sang, of course mostly rugby songs.

My next involvement in hashing was in the late seventies with the Medan hash. Monday nights were religiously reserved for hashing. Most hashers had drivers, so driving home was not a concern. Runs were tough, but the drinks afterwards were rewarding. I do not recall any run where we did not have to wade through waist deep running water. The hash stewart, equivalent of the whip, would meter out down-downs. Sometimes up to sixty each run. Once again, there was no icing nor food. Invariably, we ended up in a restaurant and then some bar till it closed at 2 am.

When I joined Seletar in 1980, the group was small. There were very few rules. None of this "The Whip is right" crap. We did not even have a whip then. We frequented the Seletar officer's mess after the run as a source of cheap beer. Driving under the influence of alcohol was not a big thing then. Luckily for us, the mess usually closed at 11 pm. Unlucky for us, we discovered Soup Tulang in the Adam Road hawker centre, so we ended up there, patronizing my godmother, Ah Soh, many a nights. Singing was a big part of hashing. Seletar hash had its own anthem, and the guitar was adopted into our logo.

Over the years, rules and tradition were being constantly introduced. Drinking and driving became a taboo. The Whip is always right. The hares are discouraged from following the pack on the run. Icing and water baths become every run affairs. Beer wagon provides the drinks. Setting runs with chalk and flour is encouraged. Once a month eat-outs are enjoyed by many. Wearing new shoes entitles you to drink out of the shoes after the run. And many, many, more.

Unfortunately, so much of the history of our hash has been implanted into those damaged brain cells we accumulated over the hundreds of Tuesday nights. There may not be a way to retrieve them, but it is good to know that there is still a group of runners who call themselves the committee, and they work hard to continue to create history and establish traditions for people like me to write about. On on on to run no. 888!

777 CELEBRATION RUN

Run site: Echo Valley, Dairy Farm Road

Date : 12-13 November 1994

There were three runs: long, medium and short. Reports for the long and medium runs (both bus out) are collected below.

The Long Run (OPTO's Report)

The "live" hares were VIRGINIA SLIM and MUFFDIVER.

As I belong to the "A" team, I boarded the 4.15 pm bus which took those who opted for the "long" run for the "bus-out" ride to the start site at Mandai quarry. The bus was filled to capacity with predominantly Kwailohs and 2 Indians. The only Chinamen were the MAD one, DEEPHOLE, SCOOTER and myself.







HASHING IN TAIPEI, TAIWAN James SQUEALING PIG Kerr

There are two Hash Chapters in Taipei, namely the Taipei H3, strictly male only and the China H3, mixed. Both are held at weekends, the Taipei on Saturdays and the China on Sundays. Both Hashes take advantage of the beautiful mountainous ranges that completely surround the city of Taipei, therefore, up to two hours are needed to get to the run site. This is one of the reasons why the runs are held at the weekends. Another reason is that during the winter months it is dark by 5.30 p.m.

Both Hashes operate a vehicle pool system which meets at the American Legion initially, followed by a re-group point, usually on the outskirts of the city. From the re-group point, the transportation follows flour laid on the roads to the run site.

All runs are marked by flour and chalk only. This is strictly enforced. The runs are all live Hare events and are extremely demanding. The Taipei Hash runs average 2 hours first runner in, and last week's one was 2 hours and 45 minutes. The China Hash 1 hour 30 minutes first runner in, all over mountainous terrain. Ropes often have to be used, especially on the Taipei Hash, not only for going up but down as well.

On the Taipei Hash the Hares are given 14 minutes head start then the pack walk for the first two minutes followed by a mad charge of around 80 runners. Similar on the China Hash, but the ladies set off at 7 minutes. The event is extremely un-nerving for the Hares as being in the mountains they can invariably be observed descending or ascending in the distance by the impatient pack. Also, sound travels extremely clear over such terrain, thus giving the impression that the front runners are closer than actual. The Taipei Hash runs average 15 kilometers. Being in such remote areas, shortcutting is definitely not an option. There is at least one injury every week, predominantly smashed noses, from sliding/falling down inclines, being stopped by a tree or rock.

The usual beer-truck is in attendance at the end of the run. Down-downs are not accompanied by the Hash song, which I found strange at first. However, on the Taipei Hash the down-downs are accompanied by loud, piercing whistles which some of the runners carry for use on the run if lost, in distress or falling behind.

The On-On is called The Bash, which is wild, putting it mildly. The beer flows furiously and the food is plentiful and excellent. Average cost, including vast quantities of beer is NT\$400, about S\$20. Equivalent cost in Singapore I would estimate to be at least S\$45. Big bottles of beer arive at the tables in crates. No need for bottle openers, the Taipei Hash guys use their teeth!

The highlight feature of the The Bash is the inevitable table dive at the end. This involves some poor individual either voluntarily, (wisely), diving or, if not, being flung face down from being swung by four others by his spread-out arms and legs to skim along a table stacked full of empty plates, glasses and beer bottles. You can imagine the effect, like 10 pin bowling!

Last time I saw Scott Summers, (SCOTTY), ex-Seletar, was last week crashing along a table head-first towards an open window, the sill of which was just below table-top height. Scotty wishes to be remembered to all at Seletar who ran between 1985-88. He is still as suave and handsome as ever. He speaks fluent Mandarin.

Sometimes the runs are in the volcanic region, which is great. The restaurants there, for Bashing, have hot springs; tapping natural boiling water, with the beer also flowing freely, is a great relief to the tormented muscles after the gruelling runs. Last week's run took us straight through the middle of the crater of a seemingly dormant volcano with yellow sulphur spurting in the air. The fumes were choking.

There is no formal membership as such, as the Chapters here are not required to be registered with any particular Authority. Therefore, there are no quarterly fees or application formwork processing. Payment for each run is made on the spot. The Taipei Hash charges NT\$150, approximately S\$8. Before you all harass the Committee about the higher cost of hashing in Singapore, I must point out that beer is cheaper here in Taiwan, about half.

To keep in shape for the weekend runs, a hardcore meet every Thursday evening to run a set route on the verge of the city. This is up through the Palace Museum grounds to the hills beyond. This takes us around 45 minutes then back to the Legion. No two weekend runs are the same. The routes vary immensely taking in rice padi fields, tea bush terraces, tangerine groves, bamboo thickets, buffalo trails, white water streams, up and down waterfalls, etc. The temperatures also vary immensely although it is warmer and more constant now. My first run during early January entailed a run site temperature of 4 degrees during the down-downs. No need to chill the beer.

The most striking feature of the Hash in Taiwan is the sheer, utmost friendliness and openness of the organisation. This especially so of the Taipei Hash, (95% locals, 5% expatriates). Any visitor or new-comer is looked after with absolutely no effort spared. In fact the level of attention given is often embarrassing. The people are absoutely genuine.

I stayed at the Fortune Dragon Hotel when I first arrived in Taipei. One morning while entering the restaurant, being the only Kwailoh amongst about 200 people, I heard my name shouted across the room. It was SNAKE HIPS. He was on a tour of the Island. I had not seen him for at least six years. By coincidence I had taken with me his headband handout from his run with KING KONG, No. 437 on August 23rd, 1988. We could not follow up as his tour group was leaving for another location immediately after breakfast. He has not changed. MUFFDIVER is very well remembered on the Taipei Hash.

To summarise, I would liken the hash philosophy here to the Oxford/Cambridge Boat Race motto - "That which does not kill us makes us stronger".



Had a cup of coffee in a coffee shop, then rang up a hash friend who was good enough to come give me a ride home.

I later found out that the hare and a few committee members had waited at the run site 'til 1.30 am. Two FWDs had gone in twice to look for me both on the Thursday triangular paper and also the Monday square paper, but to no avail since I was not on paper. I am indeed very grateful to the Thursday hash for arranging to send my car back to my hotel. This must surely be hash comraderie at its best! Thank you again PJ Harriettes/Harriers.

The moral of the story must surely be - when you are lost, ALWAYS STAY ON PAPER . . . I learn.

P. J. ANIMALES' 1000TH RUN

The Petaling Jaya Hash House Animales' 1000th run, also dubbed the XXXth Batangwealth Games, was held in Kajang, Seremban, over the weekend of May 18-19, 1996.

Not unexpectedly, the Animales were quick to accost (Concise Oxford Dictionary defines accost as "soliciting with a prostitute") Seletar's GM SAYETING, not once, not twice, but directly or indirectly through other Seletar hashers, always within our GM's ear-shot, thus:

"Why the road relay from Singapore for another chapter?"

But, locked-in, were four outstation hashers. They must have entered during the night. The key was with the stadium's security guard. Will the guard remember, and will he come to open the gate on this Sunday morning? We did not stay long enough to find out.

Thus, the moving finger writes, only to record our camaraderie with our Animales hosts.

The 1996 OR-LAN-PIGS, a.k.a. Tanjung Petri H3 888th Celebration Run, was held at Mount Austin Estate in Johore Bahru on 17th instant.

WEEKEND AT ENDAU-ROMPIN WATERFALLS 8-11, August, 1996

Endau-Rompin Waterfalls are located in secondary forest at the southern end of Taman Negara (Malaysia's National Park) in Johore State.

OPTO'S REPORT

There are many waterfalls in the Endau-Rompin National Park. Known previously only to the orang asli (aborigine) people, the falls are now readily accessed by 4 wheel-drive via logging tracks off the newly-opened Endau-Rompin highway.

Perhaps the best known and visited is Buaya Sangkok ("crocodile stuck on river"), but it was to the smaller Takapomong and Takachapak waterfalls that we went.

I like to visit a place I've not been to before. And so, when our leader William SAYETING Cheng suggested doing something over our National Day holiday weekend, I readily signed on and paid up.

"Like a Virgin" (the song), I'm a patriot. I disappear from my country when National Day comes along. But when else can a workaholic like myself get a break?

Day 1: (8th August, 1996)

We were twenty altogether (including two "outsiders"). The Seletar gang included all the perennial G. Tahan climbers. Some, eg. SAYETING and Bob DEEPHOLE Tan, and Ong TIGHT ARSE Chye Ong, brought along their wives to share the experience. The notable newcomers were PONTIANAK Stein and HARSHMAN Harjeet.

We have been on many a trek to the Malayan jungles before, but this was the first time that we were to be taken along by a professional operator. There was some trepidation, naturally, so we "kiasu" Singaporeans brought along extra food (eg.prawn sambal) and cartons and cartons of beer and stout, and brandy and whisky (in case of snake-bite).

"Rugged Outback", the tour operator, met us with three 4 WD Land Rovers at the waterfront just after the Johore customs. All haversacks secured on the roof-top racks and covered with tarpaulin sheets, and we squeezed into the already laden vehicles. The SAF would have been proud of our logistics.

Not forgetting that eating is a necessary part of the journey, SAYETING immediately called for a breakfast break in Johore Jaya, and a lunch stop in Kehang (after Kluang, from the N.S. Highway).

And after lunch, a feast of durians, durians, now in season; and mangosteens. Kipling had written: "When you eat a mangosteen, You will soon know what I mean." We entered a logging track off the main road after Kehang, and drove 23K into the Endau-Rompin National Park. This track was well sign-posted for tourists to visit the orang asli settlement, above the Endau river. Just before the park HQ, we turned into a smaller dirt track. It was along this short steep stretch that a 4 WD was necessary. We stopped (had to) at a spot just before where the road had collapsed from soil erosion. Here is Sungei Lomakoh, where we set up "base camp", in a small clearing. Tents & toilets erected, a quick wash-down beside a shallow flowing stream, and we were ready for dinner.

The luxury of having a "tour operator" soon became obvious. All cooking was done for us, and the washing-up by the orang ali, who came along as guides.

Day 2: (9th August, 1996)

The whole day was spent visiting the two very close by waterfalls at Takapomong. Back at Sungei Lomakoh, happy hour was declared and, following ancient ritual, the bar was set up on the rocks in the flowing stream.

Pauline celebrated her birthday with cake and candle, (on a day that made LKY cry). At sharp midnight, PONTIANAK too had his birthday.

Who was missing at dinner? The happy hour drinkers, and our leader, who was carried, hors de combat, from the river bed. He gave such a good performance that we asked a repeat the following night.

Day 3: (10th August, 1996)

This was the waterfall we had come for. A 3-hour trek up a stony river bed to Takachapak. From here, up a cliff- face, and along a river bed to a third un-named fall, known only to the orang asli people, who come here during the hot season to catch frogs.


Our tour operator had warned us of the many taboos associated with the jungle in this remote region. What was un-expected was the encounter with the slippery stones in the river bed, over which we had to find foot-holds. Many a twist and slip, and my brand new Nike Air, bought for this trip, split its soles.

We had decided wisely the evening before to return to base camp, when we learnt that we were the first party that the tour operator had sent along to test out Takachapak. There was no camp site up there anyway, and time would have been wasted to set up tent and shelter.

Nothing much remains except to say that we were again rewarded by not having to do the cooking and wash-up. But that did not stop Bob from cutting up the vegetables.

"Never had such a chance at home." Bob declared. I guess he summarised the mood for us all.
