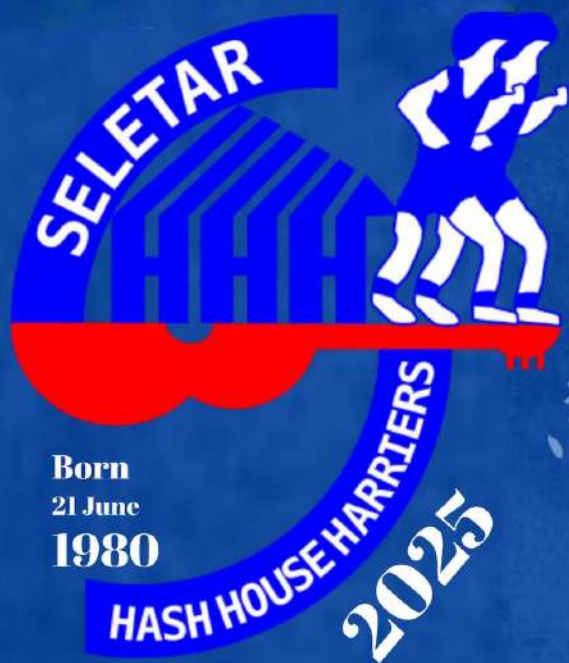

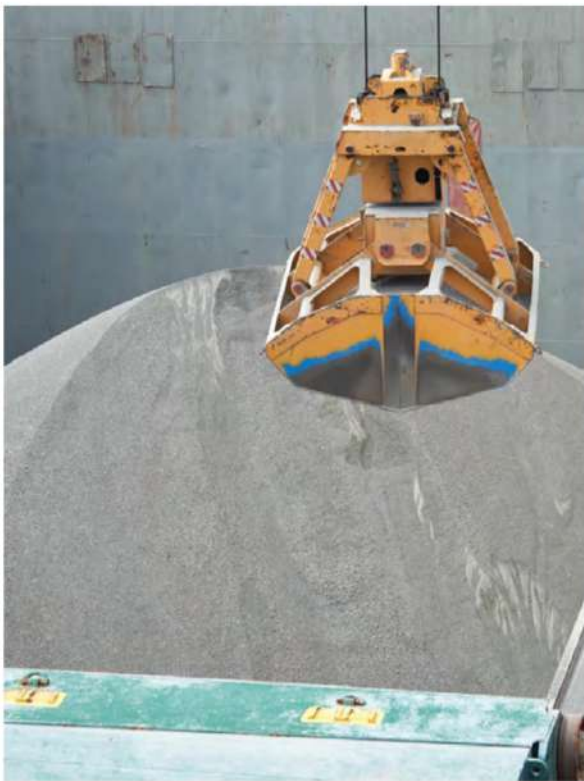

It all started 45 years ago. Wow! That's a long time by any measure. Weekly runs over the period must have covered virtually every nook and cranny of our island state. But our hares have persevered, even with the challenge of diminishing 'cross country' terrain, as the country developed its land infrastructure as part of ongoing national development. We pressed on, even though city runs became inevitably more the norm. Today, the same motley group is still pursuing, almost religiously, the trail to God knows where... the bliss of a hash 'nirvana'?

In the early years, the weekly gatherings were fun, but relatively tame. Rostered hares would set the run and organize on-site food for a turn-out of 15-20 runners. Large bottles of beer would greet us at the end of the run, to be followed up with food and a circle for 'Announcements' - the next run's hares/location/ invitation runs etc. As the attendance increased over time, it became viable to hire a beer truck. Eat-out runs were conducted on a quarterly basis to break the routine; a quick circle after the last runner is in before adjourning to the designated coffee shop. Things got interesting with the introduction of the Hash Whip and ahhh!, sitting on ice blocks. Enterprising Whips would hold centre court and could have the circle entertained for extended periods.

Invitation Runs were much-anticipated events. While we made our 21st run the first Seletar Hash invitation run, we, in turn, regularly attended outstation runs. In particular, the JB, Tanjong Petri, Sungei Ujong and PJ Animals get-togethers were most enjoyable, the hospitality of our hosts being, invariably, par excellence. Charity Runs were introduced, with one memorable event being the Singapore to Malacca Road Relay Run. Another focus was to get the families involved. To this end,

the Hash House Horrors was started so that both parents and kids could join in.

As the club kept busy with its activities, the months, years and decades rolled by. Over time, the question inevitably arose... What has been keeping this club going, over these last 45 years, with members becoming so closely knitted together and showing great camaraderie and brotherly fellowship? One explanation could be that, without members realizing it, a unique Seletar Hash spirit was evolving over the years, and had started from the very early days.

Collectively, as a group, as we participated actively, a glue was binding us together, cementing our relationships with each other. It kept our hashmen coming back for more. No doubt, we expect this unique Seletar Hash spirit to continue to flourish into the future.

We look forward to enjoying more runs with our hash friends, both at home and abroad. We await, with great excitement, the 50th Year Celebration Run in the not-too-distant future.

The "Commiddee" has decided to meet again to test the punctuality of the others on 5th June and to check on the make-up and hair-do before the final shooting.

And now for some CASHY news !!

Once our feet starts moving any other alien feet (guests) will be charged S\$5 for stepping on our grounds for the first time. After which glad to say you will be pulled by the collar to "memberization". Outstation Harriers don't worry you all will be treated kindly with no charge when invited on weekly runs, etc. unless Grand Master's in a bad mood.

SELETAR HASH HOUSE HARRIERS's HISTORY

***Where do I begin, to tell the story of how great a love can be ...
The sweet love story that is older than the sea.
The simple truth about what the club brings to me ...
Where do I start ?***

Originating in 1938 (The Hash House Harriers, Selangor aka Mother Hash) and disrupted only during the World War 2, hashing arrived in Singapore in 1962 (Hash House Harriers Singapore aka Father Hash).

Father Hash ran on Mondays and grew in membership. Singaporeans after getting a taste of Hashing in Malaysia etc., applied to join HHHS, Monday Hash, but Monday Hash had closed its membership and were not admitting new members. Another version, or so I heard, was that as more Chinamen and Mamas joined, some became disgruntled by being bossed around by ' too many Kwailohs '.

Anyway, in either case, due to the increased popularity of hashing in Singapore, it was felt that there was room for another chapter to be formed, to run on a different day.

And so it began, one fine day in the spring of 1980, James "Winnie the Pooh" Sando, John "Brewer" Chew, Martin " Salami Mabok" Baptist, Ang "Smoothie" Chuan Seng, Avtar "Avgas"Singh and Paul "Deep Shit" Ang, were entertaining the GM of P.J. Animals, Alex "The Bear", at the now closed Tivoli Coffee House.



Somehow the conversation turned to the subject of forming another club (THE BEAR made this suggestion).

There were mixed feelings at first, but by the time the evening ended, everyone was in general agreement.

Following that historic Tivoli meeting, things began to move fast.

A second meeting was convened in BREWER's Joo Chiat home, to form the interim committee and to decide on the club's name.

The name Seletar was chosen as most of the founders worked in the Seletar neighbourhood.

A Pro Tem committee met on 26 May 1980 in Kingsford Bar (now also closed) to plan the details of an inaugural run.

The run would be held on 21 June 1980, with Petaling Jaya, Sungei Ujong and Johor Bahru hashes invited as guests.

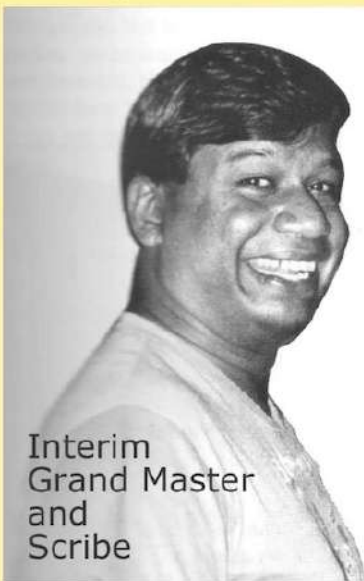


On the 21st June 1980 at approximately 1 pm, six hares set off to lay the run from their chosen runsite, Marsiling School. This was the largest number of hares in the history of Seletar as nothing was to be left to chance on our inaugural run.



There were approximately 40 participants including 5 from Sungai Ujong and 3 from PJ Animals.

The fun and games continued late into the night and carried on to Tivoli until 11.30 am, the next day.

THE INAUGURAL RUN

Hail! Salute! — the birth of Seletar Hash House Harriers! The No. 1 Run was certainly a memorable occasion. A number of Hashmen from Sungei Ujong, Petaling Jaya and Johor Baru showed up for this ‘celebration run’. Though the turn-out of Seletar Hashturds could have been better (where were you, Gootie), there were enough present to press on and make it an enjoyable occasion.

Marsiling School, the start point, and the villagers in the surrounding area, could never see a weirder crowd. After Grandmaster Sando had completed the opening announcements, the pack was off with James Abey setting the pace, horn in his horny hands. (For the records, the horn was donated by JM Martin Baptist) After the first check point, the pack soon found themselves in a muddy patch, surrounded by shoulder-high lallang (thanks, hares). Then came an up-hill stretch and a tricky bit of running between vegetable plots while trying not to kill the poor saplings, to the deep concern of farmers and their daughters! Some even stopped to take a quick shower at the rotating water-sprinkler! Then came the strenuous bit (for the stragglers, that is) of covering two more hills, going past farm houses and the Nan Chian Primary School (I’m sure I’ve got the spelling right). On the final home stretch, Sando gracefully allowed Grandmaster Alex of PJ to romp ahead. Ang Chuan Seng (that smooth character) and a few more were already home and on the beers by then.

The ‘On-On’ that followed saw the out-stationers winning the ‘boat’ race on a replay, and Ray Baptist from Sungei Ujong just edging Raspal for the ½ yard race. In the sing-a-long, Paul ‘Lucia’ Ang found his match in ‘Mario Marito’ Amaloo from Johor Baru (what a fine Hash singer he is!) The food for the On On was really something else, especially with Eddie’s ‘sambal blachan’ thrown in. Many thanks must go to Avtar’s wife, Belle, for her effort. The evening ended with JM John trying to ‘con’ everyone into drinking ½ yards, and our friendly Sikhs providing a cultural song/dance item. Still others found time later to hit Orchard Road. But that’s another story.”

The On! On! Ended close to mid-night and I heard that the outstation Hashmen with a few S.H.H.H. carried on at Tivoli till 11:50am the next day. Boy! Isn't that having a wee bit of fun.



HASH COMMANDMENTS

The novice club was able to trash out a brief hareline (8 July run - Seletar Camp, 15 July - Choa Chu Kang Cemetery). with around 20 runners usually turning up in the early days. Progress was steady.

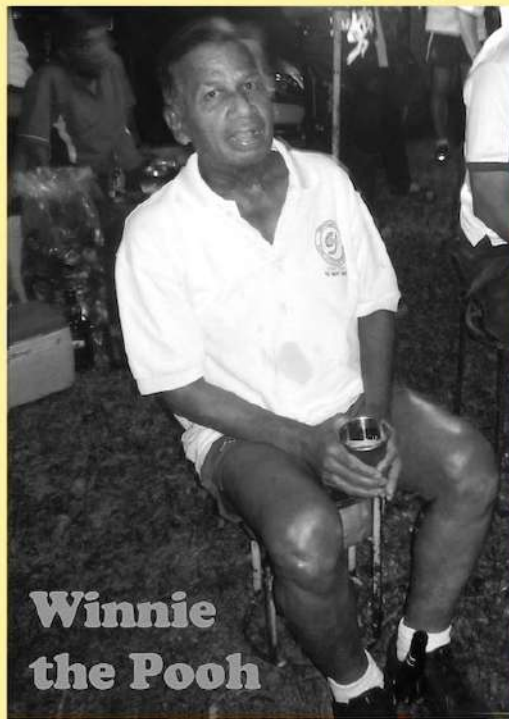
where a committee was elected for the first time and our constitution passed.

The role of our Hash Brother Chapters PJ Animals and Sungei Ujong were of great significance as PJ's GM Alex the "Bear" was instrumental in getting the ball rolling and Seletar's constitution was based on Ujong's.

James Sandosham sat as the Grand Master, later given the hash name" WINNIE THE POOH ".

Finally, a year after SHHH was formed, we got our club logo.

Abtar Singh won the " Down Down " contest during the October 1982 InterHash in Jakarta, Indonesia ... hence he was given the name CHAMP, we became " The World Champ Guzzlers " and our newsletter later called " THE SELETAR GUZZLER ".

GENERAL (Jernail Singh)'s Report:

"The 15th May, 1982 saw Seletar H3 come of age, 100 runs old. Not being the type to blow out our own candles, invitations were despatched to Hashes all over the world. Needless to say, all of them turned up "in full force", an approximately 300-strong crowd. If you are an accountant, give or take 10% of that figure.

Run-On time was 1730 but the dedicated Hosts were at the site around 1500 to warm up the place. Organisation was the key-word and T-shirt vendors, bartenders, carpark attendants, PROs and the like had a field-day on a rather muddy field. Ramesh will vouch for that and so will Jogjee.

On On was sounded by GM at 1740 after his customary "welcome" speech perched precariously over two heavy hashmen of proven ability and the group pictures were taken by no less than three pro-hash flashes.

Three minutes into the run and the crowd got cornered at the edge of a river joining the Straits. Chandran of Tanjong Petri suddenly lost his bearings and had to be quickly revived by reassurances that this was a non-swimming, non-wading and absolutely thorn-free route, to get on paper again. He bit on it.

The scenery, onlookers, cheerleaders and well-wishers were as expected on hash runs, but the false trails on this run certainly kept us all together. (Two marks for that). The pig-farms, fish-farms, pools of a yet undetermined use and nature, quicksand pits and construction sites that we ran through could have as easily been selling points on an educational tour.

On 15th May 1982, we reached our 100th Run

(What say we have the hares giving running commentaries on a loud hailer whilst we are running through these gorgeous venues.)

The T-Shirt handout point, just before the last turn home was quite unimaginative as it was on a loop which, hashologically speaking, no hashman or woman, after pumping out carbon-dioxide at 100 p.s.i. constantly for more than 3600 seconds, would be inclined to undertake. Minus two points for this Boo-Boo. (No offence to you BOO Moh Cheh).

Last runner in at 1915 and the hosts let loose their dynamic personalities with hearty hospitality and mild hostility and made everyone feel at home. I sure did my bit with Julia — made her feel "at home" that is. Don't take me on, Stu!

Brew flowed freely, even to the ground, makan got gobbled up, T-shirts got soiled, the visiting hashes let out with their verses, new acquaintances were made, some renewed, some shelved and all in all, the events added up to a most memorable Seletar H3 occasion. I am glad I was there. Let's hope SBC has captured some of it. ON! ON!

Verdict of Run: Ideal distance and country for a "Celebration" run.

Organisation: An exemplary hash effort if there ever was one, good participation and enthusiasm.

Cooperation: Full Marks

Food: As I had to scrape the bottom of the pots, I would say "it went down very well."

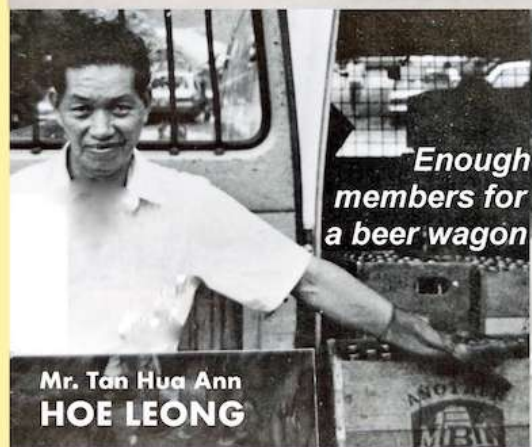

History of the Hash House Harriers

Hash House was the nickname, given for its institution food, to the Selangor Club Chambers, a social centre of the times, where some lived and many others regularly lunched. The idea of Harriers chasing paper was not new to Malaya, as there had been such clubs before in Kuala Lumpur and Johore Baru, and there was a Malacca club and the Kinta Harriers in Ipoh in existence at the time (there were also the Shanghai and Kuching clubs who had it on horseback). So the Hash House Harriers was not a new idea, but was a new show with a completely novel name.

Our story really starts on a day in Johore Baru in 1932/33 when 'Horse' Thomson, who had come to J.B. in 1932, was invited to go on a run the next Monday evening. He found himself joining a club which chased a paper trail following basic Hash rules every week, but was so magically unorganised that it had no name. The club flourished in the early 1930's but is believed to have died out around 1935. The other branch of our ancestry comes from Malacca. A.S. Gispert was transferred there in 1937/38 and joined a club called the Springat Harriers, who also operated weekly under Hash rules and are believed to have been formed in 1935. Some months

later, 'Torch' Bennett visited him and came as a guest on a few runs. By 1938/39 Thomson, Cecil Lee and Gispert had all moved to KL, and founded there their own club following the rules they had learnt elsewhere. It is not clear that it actually had a name at the beginning but Gispert is credited with proposing the "Hash House Harriers" when the Registrar of Societies required the gathering to be legally registered. 'Torch' Bennett technically missed being a founder member because he was then on leave, but on his return he introduced the first necessary minimum organisation - a bank account and a balance sheet. More important he seems, with Philip Wickens who joined later in 1939, to have helped keep the thing going immediately postwar.

Sadly, Gispert had only a short time with his extraordinary creation, being killed in the fighting on Singapore Island in 1942. But with the exception of Philip Wickens, who died in London in April 1981, the others by comparison are still very much with us, and the Kuala Lumpur Hash House Harriers is in touch with them all.

Cecil's Lee's direct association lasted, with only two short breaks (the Pacific War and another three-year period), right through to his retirement in 1961. He now lives near Leatherhead, Surrey. 'Torch' Bennett retired in the late 1950's to Durban, South Africa. 'Horse' Thomson moved to Ipoh in 1948 and now lives in the Philippines. Philip Wickens was transferred to Singapore around 1958 and to London a few years later from where he used to visit KL from time to time.

The HHH duly celebrated its 100th run on 15 August 1941, but only 17 runs later was forced into temporary hibernation by the arrival of the Japanese. Post World War II, it was nearly 12 months before the survivors reassembled. 'Torch' Bennett put in a claim for the lost Hash mugs, a tin bath and two old bags, on the fund set up with the proceeds from confiscated Japanese property and run No. 1 was a trot around the racecourse in August, 1946. Subsequent to the 100th post war run, the celebrations surrounding it were considered to be such a success that the 117 official pre-war runs were added to the total so we could celebrate the 2000th run as soon as possible. ■

Hashmen plan big bash

IMAGINE some 2,000 pairs of feet, many from lands afar, trampling across what countryside and dirt tracks are left in Singapore, chasing an elusive paper trail.

And imagine an equal number of, if not more, gallons of booze that are downed at the end of the jog-trot. But not before the otherwise executive businessmen and professionals, now sweaty and grimy in shorts and singlets, have filled the air with raucous shouts of "On-On", "Check!" or "Down-Down" quite meaningless to unknown observers.

The implausible mixture of a hot-paced run followed by free-flowing beer could only be the hallmark of a "cult" that dates back to 1938. Since its birth in Kuala Lumpur's Lake Gardens that evening when a group of Selangor Club expatriates decided to do something different to chase away after-weekend blues, Hash House Harriers have sprouted throughout the world. Many thousands from some 590 Hash clubs in 92 countries, to be more precise.

Every two years, the Harriers and Harriets (the women) converge at an Interhash meet, the previous one in April when the pseudo-athletes ran amok through the streets of Pattaya. Next Easter, the hashmen — with spouses and Horrors (who grow up to be

Harriers) — descend on Singapore, for a weekend of hash and bash.

The big bash planned for next April by the Seletar Hash House Harriers, and supported by the other three hash clubs in Singapore, will be no mere Interhash meet. The inaugural Pan-Asia Hash 1987 will have a distinctive local flavour.

"The Pan-Asia Hash was thought out after we returned from the Inter-Hash in Pattaya," said Philip Chew, chairman of the public relations/sponsorship committee. "We wanted to start a mini-world hash confined to the Asean region. The Hash originated in Malaysia, and we want to keep the Asean flavour."

But invitations have been extended to all the chapters worldwide. Singapore's brochured attractions and shopping malls have been sidelined for these hashing visitors. Their main fare comprises a choice of runs at Pulau Tekong, undulating Sembawang, Woodlands or a Malay kampung area in Punggol. Each route will be about 10 to 12km.

The run is never all there is for any Hash session — socialising is the other, if not bigger, half. Philip Chew and company plan to dish out a Singaporean cuisine with hawker fare buffet, at an open-air venue. "We hope to get hawkers

to come together. And there'll be a stage for all the clubs to put up an item," he said.

The tag-alongs have not been forgotten. Junkboat and other sightseeing trips for the wives; runs for the Horrors, and Hash-Olympics and Hash footbawls for all, are in the line-up.

The Seletar Harriers are looking to a good amount of outside support to make all the plans happen come Easter. Philip, who is a director of an international insurance broking firm, has approached the Singapore Tourist Promotion Board. He hopes to rope in other sponsors.

Meanwhile, Seletar's Tuesday sessions are going places. These sessions have taken old faithfuls like Philip, Michael Chan, a manager of a stockbroking firm; and freight forwarding manager Phil Chua, through all the green pockets in Singapore.

The club will be holding its first offshore run on November 15-16 on Batam Island. Regimental rules will be relaxed somewhat for this, a weekend family affair. It's a strictly all-male affair on Tuesdays. A Harrier who is so much as caught being sent to the run site by a female gets nothing less than a sit-out-on-ice treatment.

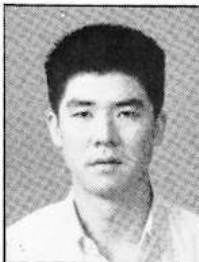
Cherian "Doc" Thomas:

Eddie 'Ichibawasan' Yen:

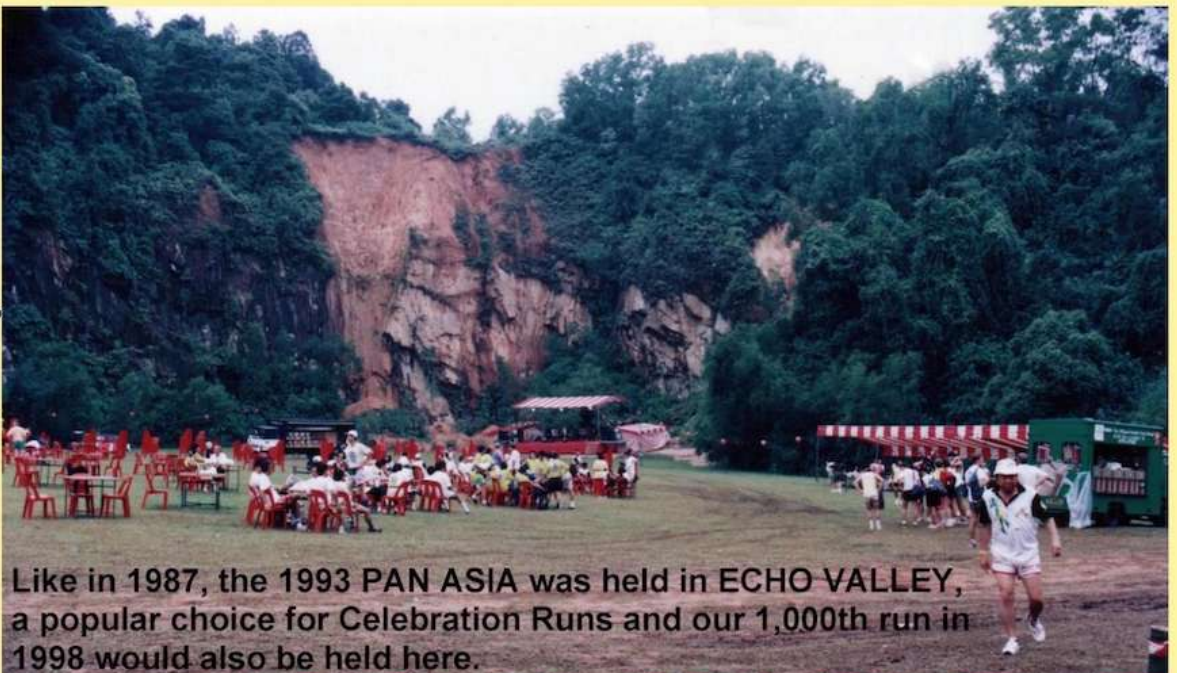

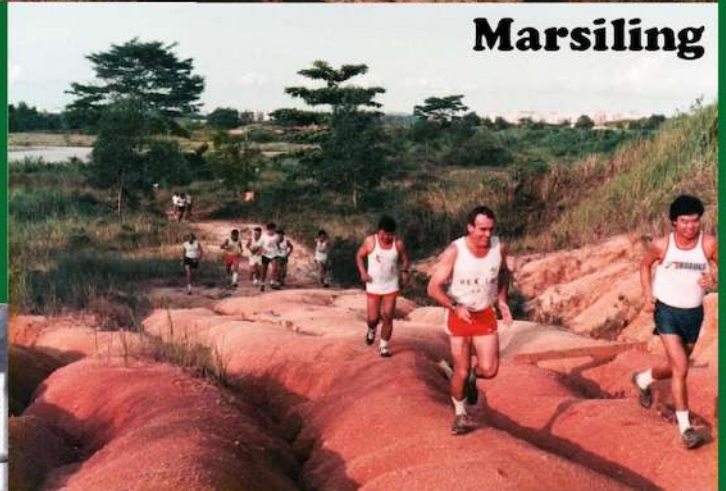


When hashing arrived in Singapore in 1962, there must have been lots of virgin jungles to explore.
