Being your typical Hasher, I cannot vouch for the accuracy, authenticity, literacy or novelistic value of this article - so it goes .....

Hashing in Singapore began way back in the early sixties with John O' Rourke leading the first 'other' pack off into the jungle (and frequently leading most of them out again). Bioengineering enables John to continue leading them off and after twenty nine years of it, has set an enviable example.

October '73 saw Ratnam's dream realised with the advent of ladies running Hash in Singapore. Our own Kamela 'Sybil' Chellum being the first Harriet Hare for Run 24 and, apprenticeships served, Caryl Gurney appointed as first Grand Mistress on Run 102.

In 1980. Seletar Hash House Harriers was formed, ably led by James Sandosham. Lion City H3 with Veronica Nally and Mike Cockman up front, kicked off in 1982.

Celebrating its 850th run, Singapore H3 broke from tradition by inviting the Harriets to join them. Needless to say, restrictions did apply, the hares being instructed to lay a trail for the ladies that was separate from the gentlemen. In true Aussie style a solution was soon found - from the S.I.C.C. two trails were set down - one for the ladies and one for the gentlemen - never more than a meter apart for the entire eight kilometers. The constitution was not compromised, boundries were not crossed but clearly, a gate had been left unlocked.

Over the ensuing years each club has enjoyed the support of its sister and brother clubs in celebrating milestones. The Singapore Hash House Harriets congratulate Popeye's gang in reaching 600 runs - we come prepared to enjoy.







## Gentlemen!

Congratulations on the occasion of your 600th Run, which so neatly co-incides with the period of celebration of Singapore's own National Day.

As it is also the 200th Run of the Hash House Horrors, I have been asked to write a little about the history of the Horrors. The Club was formed about a year and a half after Seletar's formation. Two of the founding members were Meg and Paul Jackson, who had moved to Singapore from Penang and Kuala Lumpur where they had enjoyed running with clubs similar to the Horrors. Our first run was in November 1981, and was, like Lion City's inauguration some years later, at Sime Road roundabout! We stood the children on the raised bank in order to get a good first-run photograph!

Far the first three years or so we ran once a month, but the pressure from the kids, and the parents who found it a good way to keep the kids occupied caused us to go bi-monthly. Attendance hovered around 40-60 and at about the same time we felt the need to regularise our situation. We were always a low-budget organisation. Fees per-member per-run were just \$5, and is still only \$6, and we could not afford the cost of full Societies registration. As more than one-third of the parents were Seletar families, we made the historic application at a Seletar AGM to be "adopted" as a legal offshoot of Seletar, and that has been the case since about 1984. We are very grateful to the successive Seletar committees

and have tried to show it in using our small surpluses to buy fund-raising advertisements in Seletar Hash publications from time to time. Our most recent contribution was \$1000 in February/March 1991 towards the Seletar Charity Fund which we raised by a children's sale and cash from guest fees and parent's food money.

In recent years attendance has rocketed. It peaked at a totally unmanageable 149 children, and has settled down to average 100, typically 80 members and 20 guests. We currently have 114 paid-up child members and a six-month waiting list! But not for Seletar familiers, of course, who are given preferential treatment.


We are still oriented towards kids under 10-12 years old. By the time the kids are 12+ they usually want to do something else, which is as it should be. Meanwhile we will continue to run it as a children's party - balloons, the runs (20 or 40 minutes), food, ice-cream and games. If you haven't been to see what it's all about, then come and see us one weekend.

We start at 4.30pm on alternate Sundays, and we have a permanent arrangement with Mr Hoe for food and Mr Tan for beer and soft-drinks.




Seletar Hash House Harriers' present membership is 126. During the year 27 new boots were admitted and 22 members have either resigned or defaulted.





Arriving at the car park at around 4:00 pm I was immediately impressed by the turnout of cars and buses and the rate at which the car park was rapidly filling up. As promised by our venerable Grand Master Fatso Fer, the whole world was indeed turning up for our celebration run. Cars, buses and hashers of all ages, shapes and colours were in evidence everywhere.

## The Beginning -West Coast Highway Car Park



WANT to screw a camel? The Jebels are a jovial mixed group, running every Saturday. Formed as a breakaway group from Muscat H³ in August '85, they have a group, like Seletar H³ with 120-odd members.

Think of running in the desert? In a country where the beer's as scanty as gold? The almost never-ending ON-ON (with sumptuous makan-besar to match) to the wee hours of the morning never made this foreigner feel he was really on the fringe of Sadam Hussein's political scrabble-board.

#### REFLECTIONS ON HASH LORE

Once a hashman, always a hashman. Active or not, anyone who can claim to be an ex-hashman obviously wasn't one in the first place! This life member, presently distinctly inactive: after running with many hashes around Asia since 1974, and finding a home with Seletar is proud to consider himself a Seletar Hashman and will remain so for life.

Pathfinder, a military navigator, who was a hashman for 3 months before he made a run, because he could never find the starting point! Hash Susie who earned his name by introducing what may have been the world's first "hash pussy" to one particular chapter. A lady of whom it might truly be said "She knew (in the biblical sense) the Hash in and out, up and down, back and front." The mind boggles at the thought of the heroic and enthusiastic Susie at an interhash on-on with thousands, rather than the 20 or so hashmenshe was used to entertaining.

And Slack'unt who, whilst en route via CX at 30,000ft on the way to Hong Kong for the first interhash, overheard an Aussie lady in the seat in front expounding on the "joy of running." As this lady was also headed for interhash he immediately took it upon himself to explain what hash was really about to her, shortly before being asked to leave by the pilot! Was I there? Was I ever!

So my old friends, even when you don't see me out on Tuesday, the sweat pouring off me, abusing the hares or later, amber fluid in hand, congratulating those same hares: I'm there. Damn right I am!

#### HASH GLOSSARY

#### **ON-ON**

Useful word due to wide variety of meanings e.g. call by JM starting run, denoting paper found after a check, term for venue after wagon depleted of beer (sometimes called on-on-on and on occasions on-on-on and so on).

#### **CHECK**

Time for a breather. A few members still interpret this as a signal to rush around trying to find the trail although this is fast disappearing on Seletar Hash.

#### **FALSE TRAIL**

The SCB's best friend.

#### SCB

Term used to refer to the wiser, more experienced hasher meaning in full "Sensible, Clever Bloke" due to innate navigational skills and years of experience with the terrain.

#### FRB

Term for younger, less experienced members meaning "Foolish, Raw Beginners" due to their inability to find short cuts and to hold checks. They are usually last to arrive back at the run site and so miss out on some beer. Despite their obvious shortcomings, many are befriended by SCB's and some even learn eventually to become SCB's themselves.

#### HASH WHIP

A man of immense wisdom and fairness, a veritable Solomon who only dishes out punishment for serious crimes and when there really is no alternative. He is all-knowing, even down to trivia such as who wrote this description.

#### WAGON

A much revered holy place. In no way related to this term "on the wagon'.

#### RECCE

Another fast diminishing habit which is also closely related to the hash shit award in that the number of recces are in inverse proportion to the likelihood of achieving the covered award.

#### **DOWN DOWN**

A ritual designed to reward a member for a special or notable performance such as ultra short cutting or changing in full view of the fairer sex. The ritual is the rapid consumption of a mug of beer although on very special occasions a larger volume piss-pot is used and, when directed by Hash Whip, is performed seated on a block of ice, the ultimate accolade.

#### LAST BEERS

A chilling, dread cry made sometimes mockingly by a cruel Hash brew advising depletion of the wagon's stock. It is the signal to adjourn to a pub for some beer.

#### SECOND ROUND

A call for HANS SOLO to go for his fourth or fifth round of makan.

#### BOO

Call to clear stray dogs and small children from the path of on-rushing hashmen. Also name denoting an expert reverse trail runner and "multi short-cutter" - short cuts so numerous they amount to a distance longer than the laid trail.

#### HASH HUSH

When the number of hashmen gabbling away after a run reduces to a mere 50% generally when under threat from the Hash Whip at the Circle announcements.

#### **BLUE CORAL**

The name of an indigenous venomous snake but now more commonly used to describe a particularly bad or overlong run e.g. "it was a right blue coral". The origin of this new meaning is lost in the mists of MacRitchie forest.

#### **CINDERELLA**

A recently adopted expletive sometimes used as alternative to 'Blue Coral' (see 'Blue Coral')

#### **BUS RUN**

Termused to describe an unimaginative run usually adopted by hares who are incapable of laying a trail which starts and ends in the same place with an interesting and good length run in between.

#### **HOLDING A CHECK**

No, not delaying payment U.S. style - this is an ancient custom whereby front-runners would wait at a check for a spread out tail of back-runners to catch us. It is common nowadays? Have you seen a Dodo recently?

#### **CHECKING**

What 90% of the pack call, hoping that 1-% will do.

#### MAD DOGS

These are normally seen in rural areas spiting froth and barking like Billy-O, mercifully from behind the safety of a chicken wire cage. But beware, they can take human form. For more information talk to ex-whip George Petty at his kennel.

#### **CALLING**

#### **RUN SITE**



Do say a prayer and help Gunsmoke's family, in the very best tradition of Seletar Hash – the caring hash.


Gunsmoke leaves behind wife, Balvindar, and 18-year-old son, Davinder, who is studying at the St Andrew's Junior College.
